Tilbury Golf Club hosts charity tourney

The Tilbury Golf Club's second charity challenge is Aug. 3 and the club is looking for businesses and companies to enter a foursome or else donate to raise more funds for charity.

Club owner and organizer Bob Chalut said all the money raised goes to charity.

Last year the event raised \$16,000 which was split between the charities of the eight winning teams.

Tilbury Golf Club donates the use of the course, golf and cart fees, and dinner for the fundraiser, he said.

It costs \$500 for a foursome to enter and businesses are encouraged to enter teams or just donate.

If you can't send a team, the event will pick four golfers to represent the local charity of your choice as long as you supply a registration number for your charity.

Businesses or companies that donate can get a company logo on the banner and space on the table for advertising or product display.

For an extra \$100, businesses can get advertising signs on holes.

Last year, based on the winning golf teams and the charities they played for, \$5,000 went to Prostate Cancer Canada, \$4,000 went to the Kinsmen of Windsor and \$2,000 went to the Blenheim Word of Life Soup Kitchen.

The money raised last year went to several other causes.

These include the Katelyn Bedard Bone Marrow Association, the Knights of Columbus Randy Atkinson Memorial Golf Tournament, Big Brothers Big Sisters, Windsor Veterans Memorial Committee and the Heart and Stroke Foundation.

The registration deadline is July 17.

The 18-hole shotgun scramble format tournament will take the first 120 golfers.
